Artist Profile

A lifelong sonic explorer, Dawoud Kringle's career spans five decades traversing the terrains of rock, jazz, Eastern classical, and electronic music. An accomplished guitarist, bassist, sitarist, and dilruba player, he is also the co-designer (with Jeff Slatnick and Andy Dowty of Limulus Musical Instruments) of the Dautar, a hybrid instrument that embodies his synthesizing philosophy. From international tours and major collaborations to film scores and multimedia works, his journey is a testament to the "Renegade Sufi" spirit: a relentless pursuit of artistic truth through innovation and the blending of diverse traditions.

Career Highlights & Timeline

- 2024: Founded Renegade Mystic Music & Arts Productions (RMMAP) LLC. Released the album *The Power and the Longing*, the first to feature his invented instrument, the Dautar, as the primary voice.
- 2023: Commissioned the build of and began performing with the Dautar. Became a member of the improvisational ensemble Spaghetti Eastern Music.
- 2021: Began serious experimenting with music video production.
- 2019: Granted membership into the New York Composers Circle following the submission of an orchestral fantasia and two string quartets.
- 2015: Began exhibiting visual art (paintings, multimedia) in galleries, including the curated show "On the Inner and Outer Worlds."
- 2012: First West Coast solo performances.
- 2009: First solo tour of Wisconsin and Illinois.
- 2007-Present: Pioneered a move away from traditional venues by independently producing concerts at locations like the Bowery Church, University of the Streets' Theater, Under St Marks Theater, and WoW Cafe Theater. Also performed at the Blue Note, Town Hall, the Brooklyn Academy of Music, and other prestigious venues in New York City.

- 2005: Released the album *Renegade Sufi* in Europe and the US, followed by well-received performances in Italy and France.
- 2001-2005: A period of significant growth: built his first home studio, began teaching at the Harlem School of the Arts and Bronx School of Music and Art, performed solo overseas for the first time (Paris, Milan, Zurich), and received international radio airplay.
- 1992: Shifted artistic focus exclusively to jazz and Eastern music, embarking on tours of the Eastern US.
- 1983: Relocated to New York City, working as a musician and musical director for local and touring rock groups.
- 1979-1983: Toured the Midwest US with Focal Poynt as a multi-instrumentalist and composer.
- 1970s: Began guitar at age 10; performed first professional and improvisational gigs at age 14.
